INTRODUCTION

Now that you have recently learned about lines, angles, the internal relationship between the two concepts and the calculation of the perimeter and area of a given rectangular, you can design something interesting by applying what you learned. This project is aimed at improving your ability to solve mathematics problems, motivation to turn what's in your mind into reality and practicing your skills through the experience of hand-making. Wish you would have fun!

HINTS (actually there are mainly four different stages in this project)

Here is a possible progress for your project. First of all, you should set up a target before anything starts. Then, you need to make a rough graph that can express the initial idea of your design. Afterwards, you need identify the most critical components in your design and put forward some reasonable and practical ideas to handle the difficulties you may encounter. Finally, just go for it!

PREPARATION (some knowledge, tools or materials you may use)

Know how to draw a pair of parallel or perpendicular lines

Know how to use a pencil compass and the way to **measure or graph an angle**

Know how to measure the sides of a piece of rectangular-shaped paper



Prepare some tools to cut out the shape and assemble all the components

Prepare some **cards** (hard ones are better, for **stability**, over 400g/m² are recommended)

A report of the process while you are overcoming anything difficult [40%]

An expressive essay (120~180 words is better) to describe your feelings and harvest[20%]
